Janet Holt Hilton: My Time at the Oasis

We humans have a penchant for collecting beautiful things. We see it, we like it, and no matter the consequence, own it. Despite all the negatives, we acquire that beautiful object. At first, we can't get enough of it. We take it out and look at it every day. We show our friends. We give it a place of honor. We tell everyone, and we can't wait to show off our latest acquisition.

And then it happens. We run out of time. It doesn't happen all at once. One day we just forget to bring our "pretty" out and admire it. No worries, we will make up for it tomorrow. But then, something else happens and before we know it, we've almost completely forgotten about our latest pretty thing. Maybe it is another pretty thing that we must have. Maybe it is a change in jobs, mates or homes. The potential changes are limitless. So our pretty object languishes, and is pushed further into the corner, sad, alone, bored and left to its own devices.

But let me digress. This past week, my dear friend Lisa and I were able to volunteer at the Oasis Sanctuary in Benson, Arizona. While I have followed and supported the sanctuary over a few years via the Internet, I had absolutely no idea what to expect. The Oasis is home to 700 birds, as well as dogs, horses, sheep, and other "not so desirable critters." Our first walk through the compound left me speechless (not a common occurrence) and extremely teary-eyed. Most of these once "beautiful objects" had been transformed into sad, lonely, paranoid, plucked remnants of what they once were.

In a few short years, the individuals at the Oasis, under the influence and leadership of Sybil Erden, have created a miraculous last chance for these creatures to call home and live out the remainder of their (often extremely long) lives. Sadly, they have already run out of space for the larger birds.



Life behind bars...

The "barn" is where the feed preparation takes place and where dishes are manually washed, soaked for three minutes in a bleach solution, rinsed and then refilled. Believe me when I tell you this is no small feat. While we were at the Oasis we began gathering food dishes and cleaning soon after 7:00 a.m. No one stopped until everyone had been fed, watered, and in some instances medicated, and had their cages cleaned.

The "flock" and "herd" must be fed and tended to every day, several times a day. They are fortunate enough to have 8 fantastic people caring for them. But can you really imagine 8 people caring for so many animals? Just do the math. With 700 birds alone, that entails a minimum of 2 and possibly 3 bowls per bird depending on how many birds occupy an area. Lisa commented that she washed more dishes during her time at the Oasis than she did during the entire year 2009. How wonderful if they could afford duplicate food dishes for each bird/or aviary, and an industrial sized washing/sanitizing machine. The timesaving alone would be the equivalent of adding one additional staff member.

Food is only one part of the daily routine. Every day in addition to feeding, additional tasks are performed. One day it may be hand washing cages, or raking around the outside cages. New birds are brought in and must be evaluated and properly placed. Toys and stimulation must be provided for every bird. Birds have to be counted several times a day. Since the misting system is under repair, the birds have to be manually given their baths. Cages must be checked, and when required, repaired. Perches must be monitored and replaced when called for. Beaks and nails, when required, must be trimmed.

The birds must be monitored for compatibility issues. Often "breeder" pairs will come in, and one bird will subsequently pass away. The staff tries to find another "friend" for the remaining bird, but this is no easy task. There is no "E-Harmony" for bird match making!

Once a week the staff prepares the gournet fare that is supplemented with a mixture of pellet, seeds, nuts and other goodies. Even while all of this is going on, each staff member gives their love and attention to the birds. Everyone seems to have their favorites but no one is overlooked.

Everything about the Oasis is amazing, including the flight aviaries for the male cockatoos, the female cockatoos, the African Greys and the Macaws. The aviary is a wonderful attempt to return a bit of freedom to these beautiful creatures.

But why should they even be living there? What has caused these intelligent, beautiful creatures to end their days at a place such as the Oasis?

PEAC Policies and Procedures

- 1. PEAC does not purchase birds, even to remove them from bad situations.
- 2. PEAC will accept birds donated to our organization.
- 3. PEAC does not breed birds or place any birds into breeding situations.
- 4. PEAC does not adopt birds to children.
- 5. Potential adopters of small birds are required to attend our "Avian Basic Care" seminar.
- 6. Potential adopters of medium to large birds are required to attend at least the following three seminars: "Avian Basic Care," "Parrot Personalities," and "Behavioral Problems."
- 7. Potential adopters will receive a copy of our adoption application after attending the required seminars.
- 8. All potential adopters will receive a home visit performed by one of our volunteers before being approved for adoption.
- 9. Approved adoption applications will be placed on a waiting list if a bird is not currently in our system that would be a good match for the approved adopter.
- 10. Only one parrot acquisition/adoption per home or PEAC membership is allowed in an 18-month time period.
- 11. Adopters are required to pay an adoption fee and reimburse PEAC for veterinary fees the bird may have incurred.
- 12. Adopted birds are to remain in the home and be treated as a member of the family.
- 13. Adopted birds may not be sold, given away, bred, or used for any type of monetary purposes.
- 14. After attending the mandatory seminars, those wishing to adopt a first-time large bird, such as an Amazon, African Grey, Cockatoo, or Macaw, will be required to spend hands-on time with the species of their choice under supervision of one of our volunteers before being approved.
- 15. As a general rule, we will not place a Cockatoo, Macaw, or other noisy bird in an apartment or condominium.
- 16. PEAC will not adopt birds as companions to other birds.
- 17. PEAC does not place birds into aviary situations.
- 18. Birds must remain in a 100% smoke-free environment.

If you're interested in adopting any of the birds listed above, you must attend all the seminars required for adoption and complete an application for approval. You must also show proof that you have an adequate cage and are acquainted with an avian veterinarian before taking your bird home. Adopted birds may not be bred, sold, given away or used for any type of monetary purposes! A minimal adoption fee is required, in addition to reimbursement for any vet fees that the bird you are adopting has incurred.


Double Whammy of Positive Reinforcement

Now, We Need Even More Foster Help!

PEAC San Diego and PEAC Anchorage still have an incredible need for foster homes. Who's on our waiting list? In San Diego, we already have several birds who have been waiting for months to come into our program; and just recently, we've also had to put on the list an unwanted parrot who lives in an extremely small cage and is allowed to come out only once a month. In addition, just as the newsletter was going to press, we received a call about a woman who passed away this week, and her dying wish was that her parrot be found a good home. What can we do? How can we say no to these poor birds in such great need? Desperate people who are unwilling or unable to wait for their birds to move up off our waiting list and into our program can end up selling or giving their birds to yet another parrot-clueless person, and in a year or so, the bird will be in another unwanted situation, with perhaps additional behavioral problems. Some people will even go so far as to the euthanize the pet parrot that they consider a "problem" when they "can't" wait any longer for an opening to become available in our program.

We still continue to receive large numbers of calls and emails from people wanting to relinquish parrots to our adoption program, and we are still turning away, on average, 20 parrots each month, just in San Diego, due to a surfeit of foster families.

Our foster birds come to your home pre-vet-checked and usually pre-quarantined by us. During their initial 30-day quarantine period in the home of one of our most experienced volunteers, each bird is evaluated for personality and behavior traits, to help us place it with the best possible foster match. We also evaluate your lifestyle and personality and your comments with respect to what species and personality type you think would be best for you, to ensure that the bird we are placing with you is one that we think can best succeed with you as its foster parent. Sometimes we do such a good job at this that it backfires, and the foster parent ends up adopting the bird! Why do we call this

"backfiring"? Because it opening in our foster know, love is love, and we in love with!





DIRECTOR 'S MESSAGE:

I don't know what your perception about our summer was, but my birds were starting to wonder when they were going to sprout webbed feet. They kept asking, "Do my feathers look moldy to you?" Considering we had 30+ days in a row of rain (a



new record for Anchorage), it wouldn't surprise me in the least if they were getting a bit musty. The slugs took over the garden before I could get a grip on them, so the birds didn 't even had fresh squash to look forward to (there 's lots of sugar snap peas, though, which they are very happy about). And now here we are at the end of the season, needing to start the preparations for winter.

Speaking of winter….it never hurts to make sure your emergency preparedness materials are in order. In the past three days we've had hurricane-strength winds, power outages, a 5.5 magnitude earthquake, and now today…the ultimate four-letter word…snow.

Keep your eyes open for our 2011 seminar schedule which will be released in the next edition of *Beak to Tail*. We will be holding our Emergency Preparedness Planning seminar, and will be raffling off an avian "emergency kit".

Now 's also a great time to sit down and review your bird "to-do" list. First up is make sure your bird's up to date on their veterinary records. Annual well-bird exams should not be overlooked – an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Also time to get those wing and nail trims taken care of, if necessary. Since we are going into winter months, make sure you 've got fresh bulbs for your bird 's supplemental lighting needs – just because a bulb "lights up" doesn 't mean it 's doing what it's supposed to (full spectrum lights do need to be replaced….and yes…BEFORE they burn out!). 😳

THE "CHICKEN" MEMORIAL SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

Chicken, a "Festive Amazon" (Amazona festiva) was imported in about 1970, as an adult, wild-caught bird. He was first owned by an elderly woman, a chain smoker, who had him for about 15 years and taught him to be a phenomenal talker. In 1993, she called Layne Dicker, who was doing bird adoptions; Layne immediately fell in love with Chicken. He says that Chicken was affectionate, personable, and completely trustworthy. He would sit on Layne's shoulder for an hour with his head down getting scratched, and if Layne stopped, he'd nibble at his ear, making a little growling sound. In 1998, Chicken died of lung cancer. Layne has never completely gotten over it.

PEAC has set up a memorial fund to help homeless birds with stories like Chicken's. But we can't do this without your help. 
